JURISDICTION AND VENUE

1. This Court has jurisdiction over this action pursuant to the California Constitution, Article VI, Section 10, which grants the Superior Court "original jurisdiction in all causes except those

1 given by statute to other courts.” The statutes under which this action is brought do not specify any
2 other basis for jurisdiction.

3 2. This Court has jurisdiction over all defendants because, upon information and belief,
4 each party is either a citizen of California, has sufficient minimum contacts in California, or otherwise
5 intentionally avails itself of the California market so as to render this Court's jurisdiction over it
6 consistent with traditional notions of fair play and substantial justice.

7 3. Venue as to each defendant is proper in this judicial district pursuant to California *Code*
8 *of Civil Procedure* sections 395(a) and 395.5, because the acts herein complained of, and the injuries to
9 Plaintiff, occurred in the County of Los Angeles.

10 **THE PARTIES**

11 4. At all times mentioned herein, Plaintiff ALINA PITUCH (hereinafter “Plaintiff”) is an
12 individual residing in Los Angeles County, State of California.

13 5. At all times mentioned herein, Defendant THE PERFECT EVENT, upon information
14 and belief, is a corporation of the State of California.

15 6. At all times mentioned herein, Defendant THE PERFECT EVENT, INC., dba
16 EXTREME GREEKS, upon information and belief, is a corporation of the State of California.
17 Defendants THE PERFECT EVENT, INC. and THE PERFECT EVENT, INC., dba EXTREME
18 GREEKS will hereinafter be collectively referred to as “PERFECT EVENT.”

19 7. At all times mentioned herein, Defendant PI KAPPA PHI, DELTA RHO CHAPTER
20 (hereinafter “Defendant PI KAPPA PHI”), upon information and belief, is an unincorporated
21 association formed and run in Los Angeles County, State of California.

22 8. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and thereupon alleges, that DOE Drone Operator
23 is/are an employee of Defendants PERFECT EVENT and is/are responsible in some manner for each
24 other Defendant’s acts and omissions and for the resulting injuries and damages to Plaintiff, as alleged
25 herein. When the true name(s) and capacity(ies) of said Defendant(s) is/are ascertained, Plaintiff will
26 seek leave of Court to amend this Complaint to allege their true name(s) and capacity(ies).

27 9. The true names and capacities, whether individual, corporate, associate or otherwise, of
28 Defendants DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, are unknown to Plaintiff at this time, who therefore sues

1 said Defendants by such fictitious names. When the true names and capacities of said Defendants
2 are ascertained, Plaintiff will seek leave of Court to amend this Complaint to allege their true names
3 and capacities. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that each Defendant
4 designated herein as a DOE is responsible in some manner for each other Defendant's acts and
5 omissions and for the resulting injuries and damages to Plaintiff, as alleged herein.
6

7 **STATEMENT OF FACTS**

8 10. This is a personal injury action arising from an incident which occurred on October 3,
9 2015.

10 11. On October 3, 2015, Defendant PI KAPPA PHI hosted a party known as the "Glow
11 Party" at its Delta Rho Chapter House on the University of Southern California campus in Los
12 Angeles, California (the "SUBJECT PREMISES").

13 12. Defendant PI KAPPA PHI hired Defendants PERFECT EVENT to produce the party
14 and take photographs of party attendees.

15 13. While at the Glow Party, a drone (the "SUBJECT DRONE") was used to take
16 photographs of party attendees on the SUBJECT PREMISES. The SUBJECT DRONE was operated
17 by DOE Drone Operator, employed by Defendants PERFECT EVENT.

18 14. Plaintiff arrived at the Glow Party at approximately 11:00 p.m. on October 3, 2015.

19 15. Plaintiff walked from the street up to the front door of the SUBJECT PREMISES, and
20 entered the party in the back of Defendant PI KAPPA PHI'S home. Plaintiff was at the party for
21 approximately 15-20 minutes prior to the incident.

22 16. While in the backyard of the SUBJECT PREMISES at the party, a heavy object fell on
23 Plaintiff's head, causing her to stumble forward into a friend, who caught Plaintiff before she fell
24 down.

25 17. The heavy object was later identified as the SUBJECT DRONE used to take
26 photographs of party attendees.

27 18. As a result of the incident, Plaintiff sustained injuries to the back of her head, forehead,
28 and left eye. Plaintiff's head immediately began to bleed vigorously from her wounds. Plaintiff also

1 immediately became disoriented and dizzy, due to the impact of the SUBJECT DRONE hitting her
2 head. A photograph taken of Plaintiff following the accident is depicted below:

17 19. As a result of the incident, Plaintiff's wounds were dripping blood into her face.
18 Plaintiff's friends helped her through the SUBJECT PREMISES to the front yard of Defendant PI
19 KAPPA PHI'S house. Plaintiff was helped to the front curb, where she sat while friends tried to stop
20 the persistent bleeding and called an ambulance. Plaintiff was then transported to the Emergency
21 Department at California Medical Center Los Angeles.

2 23. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that at all times mentioned
3 herein, All Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, including said Defendants' employees,
4 agents, and independent contractors, owed a duty of care to all reasonably foreseeable people,
5 including Plaintiff, to maintain, operate, patrol, service, facilitate, inspect, and/or control the SUBJECT
6 PREMISES in a reasonable manner.

7 24. Plaintiff is further informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that All Defendants,
8 including DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, were agents, servants, employees, successors in interest,
9 and/or joint venturers of their co-defendants, and were, as such, acting within the course, scope, and
10 authority of said agency, employment, and/or venture, and that each and every defendant, as aforesaid,
11 when acting as a principal, was negligent in the selection of each and every other defendant as an
12 agent, servant, employee, successor in interest, and/or joint venturer.

13 25. Plaintiff is further informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that DOE Drone Operator
14 worked at the Glow Party at the time of the incident which forms the basis of this COMPLAINT.

15 26. Plaintiff is further informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that Defendants
16 PERFECT EVENT, DOE Drone Operator, and DOES 1 through 50 owned, maintained, and otherwise
17 controlled the SUBJECT DRONE while on the SUBJECT PREMISES, and had the power to and did
18 control said SUBJECT DRONE.

19 27. Plaintiff is further informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that the DOE Drone
20 Operator had and maintained control of the SUBJECT DRONE in order to take pictures of persons in
21 attendance at the Glow Party on the SUBJECT PREMISES.

22 28. Plaintiff is further informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that the DOE Drone
23 Operator negligently operated the SUBJECT DRONE, causing it to fall from the sky and injure
24 Plaintiff at the Glow Party on the SUBJECT PREMISES.

25 29. Plaintiff is further informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that said DOE Drone
26 Operator was employed by Defendants PERFECT EVENT to operate the SUBJECT DRONE at the
27 Glow Party on the SUBJECT PREMISES, so that:

28 a. On or about October 3, 2015, and previous thereto, Defendants PERFECT

1 EVENT'S employees, including DOE Drone Operator, acting within the course and
2 scope of their employment, so carelessly, negligently, unlawfully, operated,
3 maintained, controlled, or otherwise maneuvered and/or operated the SUBJECT
4 DRONE at and near the SUBJECT PREMISES, so as to constitute an immediate
5 threat to all partygoers including Plaintiff, and so otherwise negligently conducted
6 themselves, thereby creating a substantial risk of injury to persons on the SUBJECT
7 PREMISES.

8 b. As the direct result of the negligence of Defendants' employees, including DOE
9 Drone Operator, acting within the course and scope of their employment, the
10 SUBJECT DRONE operated and/or otherwise controlled by DOE Drone Operator
11 fell from the sky and onto Plaintiff's head, resulting in the grievous injuries
12 described herein.

13 30. Plaintiff is further informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that All Defendants and
14 DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, were acting in concert with each other by assisting, facilitating,
15 encouraging, and/or otherwise condoning DOE Drone Operator's negligent operation of the SUBJECT
16 DRONE on the SUBJECT PREMISES, and as such are equally liable for DOE Drone Operator's
17 negligent behavior.

18 31. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that at all times mentioned
19 herein, that All Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, including said Defendants' employees,
20 agents, and independent contractors, carelessly, negligent, and recklessly maintained, operated,
21 patrolled, serviced, facilitated, inspected, and/or controlled the SUBJECT PREMISES.

22 32. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that said careless, negligent,
23 reckless, and unlawful conduct in regards to maintaining, operating, patrolling, servicing, facilitating,
24 inspecting, and/or controlling the SUBJECT PREMISES was the legal, direct, and proximate cause of
25 the drone incident, Plaintiff's resulting injuries and damages of Plaintiff as herein alleged.

26 33. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that at all times mentioned
27 herein, All Defendants, DOE Drone Operator, and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, carelessly,
28 negligently, recklessly, and with conscious disregard for the welfare and safety of others, including

1 Plaintiff, owned, leased, managed, maintained, controlled, entrusted, and operated the SUBJECT
2 DRONE on the SUBJECT PREMISES so as to legally and proximately cause the same to collide with
3 and injure Plaintiff while she was at the Glow Party on the SUBJECT PREMISES.

4 34. Plaintiff is further informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that pursuant to
5 California *Evidence Code* §646(c) that:

6 a. On October 3, 2015, the conduct and actions of All Defendants and DOES 1
7 through 50 constituted negligence because:

8 i. The SUBJECT DRONE would not have fallen from the sky and onto
9 Plaintiff's head absent any negligence;

10 ii. Defendants PERFECT EVENT, DOE Drone Operator and DOES 1 through
11 50, inclusive, had complete, sole, and exclusive control over the SUBJECT
12 DRONE at all times while on the SUBJECT PREMISES; and

13 iii. Plaintiff's injuries and subsequent damages were not due in any part to any
14 action, conduct, behavior, contribution, or other act of Plaintiff.

15 35. As a legal, direct, and proximate result of the above-mentioned conduct of All
16 Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, Plaintiff was injured and hurt in her health, strength,
17 and activity, sustaining serious injuries to her body which have caused and continue to cause Plaintiff
18 great physical and mental pain and suffering. Plaintiff is further informed and believes, and thereon
19 alleges, that said injuries will result in some permanent disability to her, all to her general damage in an
20 amount which will be stated according to proof, at the time of trial.

21 36. As a legal, direct, and proximate result of the above-mentioned conduct of All
22 Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, Plaintiff was compelled to and did employ the services
23 of hospitals, physicians, surgeons, nurses, and the like, to care for and treat her, and did incur hospital,
24 medical, professional, and incidental expenses, and Plaintiff is informed and believes, and thereon
25 alleges, that by reason of her injuries, will necessarily incur additional like expenses for an indefinite
26 period of time in the future, the exact amount of which expenses will be stated according to proof, at
27 the time of trial.

1 **SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION**

2 **[PREMISE LIABILITY]**

3 **(Against All Defendants and DOES 1 through 50)**

4 1. Plaintiff re-alleges and incorporates herein by reference each and every allegation and
5 statement contained in the prior paragraphs.

6 2. On October 3, 2015, All Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, occupied,
7 maintained, and controlled the SUBJECT PREMISES on which Plaintiff suffered injuries. All
8 Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, as reasonably prudent occupiers of the SUBJECT
9 PREMISES, should have foreseen that Plaintiff would be exposed to an unreasonable risk of harm at
10 the SUBJECT PREMISES. As such, All Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, owed
11 Plaintiff a duty of care.

12 3. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that at all times mentioned
13 herein, All Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, owed a duty to exercise reasonable and
14 ordinary care in the use, inspection, maintenance, and/or management of the SUBJECT PREMISES to
15 avoid exposing any and all persons, including Plaintiff, to an unreasonable risk of harm. All
16 Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, should not have permitted any and all persons,
17 including Plaintiff, to use the SUBJECT PREMISES without providing suitable levels of safety
18 precautions.

19 4. Plaintiff is informed and believes, and thereon alleges, that at all times mentioned
20 herein, All Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, knew that persons, including Plaintiff, were
21 using the SUBJECT PREMISES. Reasonable diligence would have revealed that the SUBJECT
22 PREMISES was not being maintained with suitable safety precautions, thereby creating a dangerous
23 condition. However, All Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, did not rectify the dangerous
24 condition. Thus, All Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, breached their duty of care, inter
25 alia, by creating a dangerous condition, which exposed lessees and guests, including Plaintiff, to an
26 unreasonable risk of harm.

27 5. As a legal, direct, and proximate result of the above-mentioned conduct of All
28 Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, Plaintiff was injured and hurt in her health, strength,

1 and activity, sustaining serious injuries to her body which have caused and continue to cause Plaintiff
2 great physical and mental pain and suffering. Plaintiff is further informed and believes, and thereon
3 alleges, that said injuries will result in some permanent disability to her, all to her general damage in an
4 amount which will be stated according to proof, at the time of trial.

5 6. As a legal, direct, and proximate result of the above-mentioned conduct of All
6 Defendants and DOES 1 through 50, inclusive, Plaintiff was compelled to and did employ the services
7 of hospitals, physicians, surgeons, nurses, and the like, to care for and treat her, and did incur hospital,
8 medical, professional, and incidental expenses, and Plaintiff is informed and believes, and thereon
9 alleges, that by reason of her injuries, will necessarily incur additional like expenses for an indefinite
10 period of time in the future, the exact amount of which expenses will be stated according to proof, at
11 the time of trial.

13 **PRAYER FOR RELIEF**

14 WHEREFORE, Plaintiff ALINA PITUCH prays for judgment against all Defendants as
15 follows:

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17 **First Cause of Action:**

- 18 A. General damages in an amount subject to proof;
19 B. Special damages according to proof;
20 C. Costs of suit herein; and
21 D. For such other and further relief as the court deems proper.

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DEMAND FOR JURY TRIAL

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2 Plaintiff ALINA PITUCH, an individual, hereby demands a trial by jury as to all causes of
3 action.


